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

Dividing Tens and Ones Game

Prep-Work:

- 1. Print off pumpkins (one for each player) and print off spinners (1 page for two players)
- 2. Gather up board markers, pencils, and paper clips. You can also provide calculators.

Directions:

- 1. Player one spins the spinner made of a pencil and paper clip.
- 2. Then player one solves the problem, and player two checks it on the calculator.
- 3. If player one answered correctly, he may cover up that number on the pumpkin.
- 4. Now it is player two's turn to spin and solve, while player one checks the math.
- 5. Players take turns doing this until someone has covered up every number on the pumpkin.
